...was the last Friday of the month as well as last Friday of the year, so it was open.



The June 18 event was held at the Bard Mansion at Naval Base Ventura County.

The event was chaired by Lions Elvie Marfil and Carlos Holanda of the Simi Valley club. It was designed to bring together local clubs to share in a celebration honoring past, present and incoming officers and members.
