This is an update on Project Lifesaver for Ventura County.

After the last series of meetings here are our accomplishments to date:

1. Lions Clubs have committed \$4,250 dollars. At the proper time these funds will be sent to a separate account at Senior Volunteer Services. See below-
2. The Ventura County Sheriffs Department will acquire funding to purchase the startup Project Life-saver kit approximately \$5800.00 to \$6000.00. Ken will advise us on the progress of this effort. Captain



Ken Cozzens also noted that he sent some of his DART team to the demo up in San Luis Obispo and they were very impressed. In a prior conversation, Rolf noted that the delivery and turn around time for the kit and training is the six to ten week time frame. So if all goes well we should be ready in the Dec.- Jan. timeframe.

3. Senior Volunteer Services located in San Luis Obispo will be doing the

client billing and the bookkeeping arm to the program. They are currently doing this for the program up there and the Director Diane see no issues for implementation here. She indicated that it would be best to speak to their bookkeeper to discuss setup and fund transfer as we get closer.

4. Alzheimer's Organization will act in assisting to train the DART team and as a client referral to the program gatekeeper.

5. Senior Concerns is currently reviewing their role

and responsibilities as the GateKeeper for Thousand Oaks.

Currently active participants to the organizational board are Fran McNiell, Ken Cozzens, Arlene Reynolds, Dennis Amick, and myself. As the board takes a more formal shape we will need our Lions Clubs to look within to review if there are members who have an interest in board participation. Board positions are Chairperson (runs meetings), Vice chairperson (assist Chair, fill in during absence), Secretary(meeting minutes), Treasurer (S.V.S will provide reports to Treasurer. Treasurer will disseminate information to board). Other positions are the advocate advisor. Currently, SHF/DART, Senior Concerns, Alzheimer's, Coast CRC, and others?? to be advocates/advisor positions on board. This will also be a great opportunity for the club that is in the forming stages in Thousand Oaks. This might make an excellent rallying point for a project for that club to build membership.

Duties of the board are to review and approve purchase recommendations made by its advocate/advisors; meet on a monthly basis, provide community awareness of Alzheimer's and Project Life-Saver. The future venue for Advisory Board meetings will probably be Camarillo and will be dinner. These will be monthly. Looking for input on this - Currently



our Organizational Board has been meeting in Ventura.

Project note – This is a Lion's sponsored project. Lions welcomes all community service minded citizens and groups to participate in the project at any level. We will offer these contributors with shared publicity or as an advocate/advisor position to the board.
